During the 2016 calendar year, in addition to our normal duties and responsibilities, the Caroline County Sheriff's Office was fortunate enough to participate in a number of worthwhile events, some of which included Meet in the Middle, National Night Out, the DEA Takeback initiative, Cops 4 Kids, and the Law Enforcement Torch Run in support of the Special Olympics. During this year, the CCSO also solved a major credit card fraud case that produced evidence of over 75 fraudulent credit cards, 30 cartons of cigarettes, and numerous credit card forgery devices. 2016 became the first year that the Caroline County Sheriff's Office has had deputies certified in Commercial Motor Vehicle Enforcement. 2016 was also the first full year with a new radio system in operation.

There were two promotions during this past year. Lieutenant J. Crowder was promoted to Captain, and Deputy C. Wright was promoted to Sergeant. Deputy Garthaffner, Deputy Walsh, and Deputy Bradley graduated from the Regional Academy.
